President's Message

from Gary Clayton

The Board of Directors meeting in November was quite productive. Several major issues were discussed. One subject was the poor turnout at rides and the decrease in the number of rides in the Region. Our membership showed a slight increase, thanks in part to our Membership Committee of Sallie Kudra and Mary Britt. We also put on two clinics and have initiated a very good mentoring program for new and inexperienced competitors.

It is fruitful to look back at the 2011 ride season and determine what we did that was successful, and what we can improve on. The board recognizes that fuel cost is a major deterrent to riders. Since there is nothing we can do about fuel prices, we need to look at other ways of getting riders to participate in our sport. Since so many riders cannot afford to travel long distances, the board recognized that there is a need to encourage a better turnout of local riders. In the past, the most effective means to do that has been through clinics. To date, there are clinics scheduled in Georgia, Tennessee, and Florida in 2012. The board is committed to helping anyone interested in putting on a clinic. For detailed information and help, contact Linda Clayton at lindaclay@aol.com.

Another problem discussed was the decline in the number of rides in 2012. As of this writing, ten rides are scheduled. This is down from the eleven we had in 2011. The Benefit Ride will be held, but at a different location and a new date. R5's main problem is finding people who are willing to try managing a ride. The board understands the fear of losing money—that's a hardship, particularly in these difficult economic times. Again, however, the board is willing to assist, mentor, and provide financial guidance to anyone willing to try. Living near the ride site is not necessary, and R5 has a program to pay the ride insurance cost for a new ride's first 2 years.

Remember that the Mini-Convention is coming up February 25 in Greenville, SC. We are looking forward to a large turnout. Please plan to come and take part in the activities. See more information about speakers and events on page 5 of this newsletter.

I'm looking forward to seeing everyone out on the trail.

Editor's Letter

from Kathy Nicholl

Mark Twain once said, "There are three kinds of lies: lies, damned lies and statistics." I recently sent a letter to the national board and I think it became a statistic. I submitted some ideas I had for keeping a printed *Hoofprint* magazine for members (such as myself) who didn't want the electronic version.



Since I may have been the only one who actually submitted something in writing, it is easy to see why my letter may have been treated as an insignificant "statistic," just one member's viewpoint.

Yet, somehow, it doesn't feel right to have my opinion ignored. Of course, I don't know how *all* of Region 5 feels about this issue, but I do know that *some* Region 5 members feel as I do. So I have an unusual request to make of ALL (lifetime *and* regular) Region Five members: would you ALL please use the yearly dues renewal time to speak up about how *you* feel? There is a new application form (printed on page 15 of this issue) that I have modified to include a small survey portion at the bottom. The survey is extremely simplistic, maybe you won't like it, but that's fine. I added blank "Comments" lines on the bottom, where you can put your thoughts into your own words.

The next national BOD meeting is March 8, 2012, and I would love for Laurie DiNatale to come to that meeting with the application/survey form which ALL 180 R5 members have filled out and mailed in this January (or February). If you want to renew, have already renewed, or are a lifetime member, or even don't intend to renew, *please* fill out the form and mail it in—all it will cost is a first class stamp. And if you haven't renewed yet, it won't even involve an additional stamp. One person's response

may easily be turned into a statistic, but many members of Region Five create valid data that hopefully will be given the consideration it deserves. But if only 25, or even 50, or even 100 respond, it might still be considered a "statistic," or, at best, a "damned lie." What have you got to lose except a stamp?

My survey questions include a place for those who want a printed and mailed newsletter to consider paying additional dues money. Now NATRC's application *used* to offer a printed *Hoofprint* for \$18 a year, and I think this is a pretty accurate guess as to yearly costs for printing and mailing. Since R5 may also decide to go electronic with our newsletter, the survey asks for similar data for R5. Our newsletter costs last year were about \$8.85 per membership to print and mail out the newsletter (switching to first class mail raised the cost, but it improved delivery time). So think about it a little and try to indicate what you think should be covered by dues and what you think is a reasonable contribution from you.

I have been told that, if requested, *Hoofprint* can still be printed and mailed at no additional cost for 2012; but it sounded to me as if that it would be mainly for people with no access to a computer. I don't know what will happen, but I hope you'll speak up and provide our national BOD with real data about how its members feel.

If you don't want to tear out or xerox the last page of this newsletter, you can (if you have a computer) go to www.natrc5.org, where you can open this Winter 2012 issue and print out page 15. If you don't want to do that either, just send in a hand-written sheet of paper with your input—it's not the format, it's expressing your opinion that matters.

NATRC is a great organization and needs our help to continue. Your renewal is so very important, and I hope you will not only renew, but will spread the word and encourage others to "come ride with us." Please renew now using the renewal application on page 15, and also take a moment to let our national leaders know how you feel.

Summary of RFTRA BOD Meeting Minutes

The meeting of the RFTRA Board of Directors was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on Nov. 19, 2011, at the Hampton Inn in Norcross, GA by President Gary Clayton. Present were Board Members: Connie Driskell, Linda Clayton, Cathe McKinnon, Gary Clayton, Wayne Tolbert, Kim Cowart, Tammy Lineback, Regina Broughton, Tanya Kingsley, Cindy Keen, and newly elected Board Members: Paula Riley and Lori Rand. Tom Anderson attended as a guest.

Correspondence: Cindy Keen **MOVED** that Region 5 make a donation of \$50 to the humane society of Mary Leslie's choice as a memorial to her husband, Hank. Tanya Kingsley seconded, the motion **PASSED** unanimously.

Election of 2012-2014 Board Members: Elected to the Region Five Board for the 2012-2014 term are: Cindy Keen, Lori Rand, Paula Riley, and Cathe McKinnon. The alternate board member is Patty Lucas (who will serve as an alternate along with Courtney Keen Woodall).

Election of National Board Member: Gary Clayton was re-elected as the Region Five National Board Member.

Treasurer's Report: Connie Driskell reported on the current financial status of RFTRA. Current bank balances are: RFTRA Wachovia Checking: \$13,523.37; RFTRA CD at Capital Bank: \$9,225.35; Ride Management Support BB&T Checking: \$2,011.60; and Ride Management Support BB&T CD: \$6,073.25.

Equipment Management Report: Wayne Tolbert will no longer be Ride Equipment Manager. Tammy Lineback and Paul Riley volunteered to share this job in 2012. Connie Driskell is going to purchase a funeral-home tent for use at the Biltmore rides in order to save money that would otherwise have been spent on tent rentals.

President's Report: Gary Clayton reported that ride turnout for 2011 has been discouraging, especially at the Kings Mountain ride. Board Members discussed reasons and possible solutions for low rider turnout.

Points and Awards: Tanya Kingsley reported that regional awards are ready, but that the Board needs to decide on the 2011 recipient of the Shannon Memorial Award. Tammy Lineback **MOVED**, Lori Rand seconded, and a recipient was nominated and **APPROVED** unanimously.

Ride Management Report: Linda Clayton reported that Honey Creek was a new ride for 2011 and will be scheduled every other year in rotation with Sara Baldwin's Sweet Halloween ride in Rockford, AL. The Board also discussed ways to encourage and to support ride managers. Paula

Riley will head up this initiative with assistance, advice, and education for ride managers.

Computer Equipment: Linda Clayton said that the region's computer and printer are both still fine.

Membership: Sallie Kudra's e-mailed report was discussed. Region Five currently has 236 members. Gary Clayton stated that our region has the most members of all the National Regions.

Fundraising: Cindy Keen reported that the Region earned a total of \$17,697.25 through Fundraising Efforts in 2011. The National Convention, the Region Five Store sales at rides, and the silent auction at the Heart of Dixie ride were the main fundraising efforts. She added that Terry Silver is selling Equine Science products through the Region Five Store and in 2012 will donate 20% of her sales to the store.

Ride Scheduling: Kim Cowart reported that currently Region Five has 9 rides sanctioned or verbally committed to for 2012. Cindy Keen opened a discussion about the Region Five Benefit Ride stating that based on rider comments and participation, the Dawson Forest site may have run its course, due to heat/rocks/lack of facilities. Cindy Keen is pursuing another site in Dublin, Georgia, for the Benefit Ride, and the dates available are either April 15 or May 5.

National Director's Report: Kim Cowart presented the report.

OLD BUSINESS:

Region Five Mini-Convention: Kim Cowart reported the following:

Region Five Board Meeting: The Board will be meeting on Friday evening and Saturday morning at the Phoenix Inn in Greenville, SC.

Speaker Sessions: Speaker sessions will run from 12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., with 3 hours of speakers with 15 min. between each.

Happy Hour: will be from 5:30-6:00 p.m. with a cash bar.

Dinner will be a buffet at 6:00 p.m., with awards to follow dinner.

Awards: Martha Findley will MC the evening and have photos of winners. Lori Rand gave the board a preview of a video that Amanda Rand has made, that will also be shown at awards.

Penny Auction: Tammy Lineback will hold the Penny Auction during Happy Hour. You may purchase permanent numbers for the 2012 ride season for: \$50 novice, \$75 CP, and \$100 Open.

Entertainment: Courtney Woodall will plan line dancing from 9:00-11:00 p.m., after awards.

Tammy Lineback also suggested that there be a Ride Manager Recruitment table with information and paperwork samples at the Mini-Convention. Paula Riley volunteered to do this.

Sessions: Gary Clayton discussed and agreed to contact several very interesting speakers: Janice Raddatz, who rode the Pacific Crest Trail from Mexico to Canada, and Pete Dillingham or Donna Maye West on Natural Horsemanship, and Dr. Troy Nelson on Chiropractic.

Marketing: We will all make efforts to encourage



members to attend the Mini-Convention. Courtney Woodall will put together a flyer for the Mini-Convention. She will lead the effort and assign direct-mail addresses to us for advertising it.

Mini-Convention Committees: Registration: Linda Clayton and Connie Driskell; Penny Auction: Tammy Lineback; Theme: "To the Next 50 Years"; Awards: Tanya Kingsley; Table Decorations and Door Prizes: Cindy Keen; Programs: Regina Broughton; Speakers: Gary Clayton.

NEW BUSINESS:

Gary Clayton asked if members like the electronic newsletter and many members do like it. We also like the NATRC Region Five Facebook page. Gary Clayton also reminded us that National Board members have Raffle Tickets for sale.

Proposed Bylaws Change: Cathe McKinnon presented a proposed By-laws change to clarify the election and representation of Region Five Board Alternates. Cathe then **MOVED** that this by-law change be proposed to the membership. Kim Cowart seconded the Motion. After discussion of the proposal, Kim Cowart suggested that the motion be tabled. Kim Cowart **MOVED** to table the motion for further review. Cindy Keen seconded. All approved, and the motion to table the proposed by-laws change was **APPROVED** unanimously.

Vanguard Investments: Tom Anderson gave a presentation on Vanguard accounts to invest excess funds. Connie Driskell and Tom Anderson will work together to set up this account and bring it to the February meeting for discussion.

Newsletter Editor's Report: The Board read Kathy Nicholl's report. Regina Broughton volunteered to continue to find ride stories for the newsletter in 2012.

Alabama Horse Council: Gary Clayton reported that the Alabama Horse Council meeting is Jan. 21-22, 2012. In the past we have provided money for this. Cindy Keen **MOVED** that we give \$250 for this and Linda Clayton seconded. All approved and the motion **PASSED** unanimously.

Southeastern Trails Conference: The SETC will meet in Lexington, KY, on July 12-14, 2012. In the past we have provided \$500 for a booth and entry. Cathe McKinnon will attend. Connie Driskell **MOVED** and Kim Cowart seconded that we approve \$500 for SETC Registration. All approved and the motion **PASSED** unanimously.

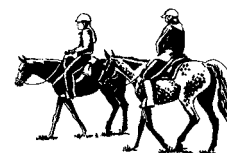

Where Are My Friends???????

It was Spanish Trail in March when I had last seen my NATRC family. My summer project was a regional Southeastern Equestrian Trails Conference hosted in Alabama that took almost *all* my free time. No time to condition for the rides after March, so I was committed to "doing for the general good" and not riding.

So, here it is—my first NATRC outing in 6 months. Ginny and Wayne Tolbert always put on such a great ride at East Fork Stables in Tennessee, plus Ride the Edge is one of my most favorite rides—not that it's easy, but it *is* breathtaking! Friend Patty Lucas and I trailered up early on Thursday, and settled in quickly and comfortably, the horses loved the stalls—we were home! Just seeing the familiar faces (and horses) made me feel like a schoolgirl—I was tremendously happy to be back among my NATRC family. If you saw someone skipping around the campground like a schoolgirl (someone with grey hair that is), that would be me!

The ride could not have been better, from initial check-in to final check-out. Even though the area had 8 inches of rain on Wednesday, resulting in some definitely muddy areas, it also brought cooler weather, and the dust was gone! The atmosphere in the camp was warm, and folks were having a good time. Since I had not had the time to really condition Skyy for the ride, I had thought about doing just a one-day; but cooler weather, stalls, etc., just said it's okay to do two days, so that's what I did!

Saturday's ride had its share of mud; but the horses all did well. Georgia and Skyy behaved like seasoned NATRC horses and handled it all. *Great P&R's*, metabolics, and manners. Apparently Skyy remembered his earlier training, which made me so proud (you may remember this is the horse that on his first NATRC ride reared every time we came to a judge?)

Sunday's ride was drier but more challenging (at least to me!). Some of the water crossings had *huge* rocks jutting up on the far side, giving me cause for concern; but apparently Skyy was unfazed. On one huge rock, he put his front legs up (not jumped), then pulled his back end along. The power I felt was unbelievable; and he did it in his "Mr. Whatever" style.

Down at Owen's Homeplace, Patty and I tossed some cut apples in the water tub; and Skyy and Georgia "bobbed for apples," getting every morsel. It was their treat before the hard climb to Deer Gap. We've bobbed for apples the past couple years, and actually think our horses look forward to it.

Our vet judge Stephanie Ostrowski did an awesome job (as always), keeping our horses safe throughout the ride. As we reached the plateau on Sunday, there she was checking metabolics and making sure the trip uphill had not been too much for horse (or rider!). That climb to me really highlights horse and rider working together. Between the rocks and the degree of climb, it's tough! What a gorgeous ride and what a true blessing to be in the woods, with my horse, with my friends, and with God's awesome beauty.

So final checkout and awards. We both did better than I thought. Skyy had a 97 and 3rd, I had a 99 and 4th! WOW! How cool was that! Awards and then potluck dinner. Life is good!

So now you ask, what about "Where are my friends?" Well, life has many challenges and unexpected turns. Earlier in the day, my right knee had given out during a vet check (I was Grade 3-4 lame). While back at the trailer after



our group potluck, I leaned up against an inside trailer door, my knee gave out again, and then I toppled out backwards through the unlocked escape door, hitting the door frame, then the running board, and finally the ground. On the way down, I literally saw my left leg blow up (almost double in size)! It was like an airbag going off (the surgeon said all the blood in my leg just “exploded”). I had shattered my left femur (upper part of the leg), turned my left foot 90 degrees left, and was lying on the ground, yelling for my friends. And there they were!

Thanks to prior planning by the Tolberts (who knew it would be needed after the ride), the ambulance was there lickety split, and the left leg of my pants was cut off (how lovely is that in front of your friends?). On the one hand was Patricia Petelle, on the other Sara Baldwin, at my head Patty Lucas, and everywhere—Ginny, Elaine, Cheri, Wayne, Gary, etc., etc., etc.. Injured as I was, you were all there.

I spent 5 days at the Crossville Cumberland Medical Center in Tennessee and had a rod installed in my leg (yes, it’s mine to keep now), and then was ambulated back to our Birmingham Lakeshore Rehab Hospital, where I spent 15 days. And yes, you were all there! Following me to the hospital, spending Sunday night with me in the Tennessee hospital until my husband could get there Monday, taking care of Skyy and bringing him home safely (NATRC training made it easy for folks to help him!), the phone calls, the emails, the cards, the visits, the unexpected flowers and book. Knowing you care—I was, and still am, *so* touched by all of you and how you have helped me through those very trying times.

Even 10 weeks after the accident, I realize that despite the accident, I am truly blessed. The cane is just about gone, I have been mounting almost daily (although my husband says I’m losing style points right and left!), have even ridden around the barn several times and back! Therapy and attitude are key, but YOU have always helped me keep a positive attitude.

And so, the answer to the question “Where are my friends?” **They are everywhere!** You may never realize how much you have all done for me, but I thank everyone for all the help and for all the good wishes you have extended to me.

I’m already planning on Spanish Trail 2012 and getting ready to go! Should I place last or first, it really won’t make any difference, because I will again be among my friends. And that is worth untold blessings! See you on the trail soon!

December update: My fall started with my right knee buckling. During rehab on my left leg, the weakness surfaced as I tried to protect my left knee with my right leg. So the good news is that I know my right knee caused the fall, the bad news is that surgery is scheduled on December 16 to correct 2 meniscus tears in my right knee. But the better news is that recovery is supposed to be very quick; and combined with the rehab I have been doing so far, I’m told that I’ll be able to finish up quickly with the rest of my rehab. Thanks to the Lord, my precious husband, and

all my friends, I’m working on keeping a positive spirit, saying to myself: “Better now than a couple months down the road and having to start all over again.” Skyy and I are still focused on Spanish Trail and look forward to seeing you all!

On Being a Gracious, Grateful Guest

We in Competitive Trail riding are blessed with having the opportunity to ride our horses in beautiful, scenic, varied, and unique places. Sometimes this is state or federal forest land, sometimes it is private property, and sometimes it’s a combination of the two. I know of at least one ride that allows equines on the property only once a year, for an NATRC competition. Often we arrive to find trails that are permanently maintained and well cared for.

With the good fortune of being able to ride these trails, we need to recognize that we come as guests. We might be guests of the Forest Service, the landowner, the club that maintains the trails, or a combination of the above. The important thing to remember is that we are guests on someone else’s “home” trails. If we want to be invited back, we need to outwardly show our gratitude to the folks that call these trails “home.”

An easy way to do this is to be pleasant to any pleasure riders you might encounter on the trails. Yield the trail to them (it is their “home,” after all). Ask them if they’re having as good a time as we are. Let them know how beautiful their trails are. If you need to pass them, ask first, and then proceed quietly so as not to upset their horses. If they have yielded the trail to you, be sure to thank them for that courtesy.

Be sure to be gracious to your host (the campsite, the Forest Service representative, the private individual) for the privilege of allowing you to visit them. Even when we have paid a fee for using the facility, we still need to let them know that we enjoyed our time with them. It’s especially nice when our hosts are introduced at ride briefings. This gives us the chance to recognize them should we see them later and to offer our personal “Thank You.”

Finally, we need to be aware of the footprints we might leave. We want these to be as small as possible, so as to leave the trails and camp as nice, or nicer, than we found them. It’s easy to make sure that we properly dispose of all our manure and hay. But did we pick up all our trash? Fill in the hole our horse dug? Patch ruts in the road or pasture we camped in? Fix or pay for any damage

our equine or we did to structures or trees?

For most of us, the answers are a resounding YES! NATRC is a wonderful group, which is why we have had access to many of the facilities and trails for decades! But let's never lose focus on our need to be gracious and grateful guests while enjoying someone else's "home" trails. Hope to share many trails with you in the future.

Well, on Oct. 7-9, we did it again. I hadn't planned to do so. After all, Terra is 26, but a certain member of the Starnes family called me and talked me into it. In retrospect, I'm truly glad that she did. The fall weather was great, and we got to ride a new trail across the French Broad river. Our judges, Mike Bridges and Bill Sherfese, made it an interesting weekend. And once again, Connie Driskell treated 3-day riders to 3 meals a day and one-on-one ride briefings, allowing us to get as much rest as possible. I had a great time.

This time there were six 3-day Open riders: Paula Riley, Regina Broughton, Lori Lee Williams, Anne Sexton, Tammy Lineback, and myself, and we all finished—with smiles on our faces.

On our first day of competition (Friday), we had 4, yes 4, P&R's; the last one ended with a CRI (cardiac recovery check). Normally a CRI is done directly after a P&R, but this one was about 1/4 mile after and I'd trotted for most of that. Terra lost points because of that, but I think just about all of us did. Saturday had 3 P&R's and Sunday 2. However, the only P&R points Terra lost were for the CRI.

Bill is known for hiding at obstacles, and he often did so this weekend. At the first observation, crossing Dingle Creek, I saw Mike and his secretary, but didn't see Bill—although he watched us go down into, across, and up out of the creek. Terra was calm, cool and collected, and apparently I was also.

We had a steep downhill and then a back up before getting onto River Road, where both Mike and Bill observed. We were still calm, cool and collected, and the scorecards reflected that.

Mike did a soundness check as we went by at an extended trot. Bill was hiding on that one. Terra was sound,

and I was apparently looking good as well. The next time we saw both Mike and Bill, they had a 'L' shaped sidepass obstacle set up, and we didn't do quite as well on this one. Terra could see riders approaching us and she was much more interested in them than in paying attention to me. She got a slow to respond from Mike, and while I got a good use of aids for the sidepass, I got a minus for not having her positioned to keep from stepping on the logs. Ah, well, can't win them all.

Later we were instructed to hurry down the trail and be prepared to do an emergency dismount. My thought was "Oh joy, will I have enough knees to do this?" When we got to the judges, I was instructed to do the emergency dismount. To my surprise and delight, I had knees, and Terra stopped and stood for the entire procedure. Of course, when you dismount, you have to get back on, so we had a judged mount as well. Terra was good as gold again, so we both got positive comments. Yay!

Then we had a Stop (from a trot) and Sing. I did my best Janis Joplin impression of "Mercedes Benz" for the Sing. Terra got a good response and I got a good Stop and bad Sing. Well, they asked for it. Bill watched us cross the road at Big Rock. I figured he was there (I've secretaried at Biltmore before). Sure enough, when I got past the rock, I heard a whistle and turned to see Bill waving at me.

Mike had us stop on an uphill near the old carriage house. I saw Bill on the left as I went up. I thought Mike might want to do a metabolics check, so just stopped facing him. I belatedly turned sideways on the trail when I realized Mike just wanted to see us stop, but Bill got me for not turning right away. Terra got an OK, me, not so much. *C'est la vie.*

One notable obstacle was a Name It & Claim It, where Bill let us choose our own obstacle. I chose to back up. Bill asked me how far I was going to go and I said until he told me to stop. I got to back up a long way for my unimpressive choice. Hah! We did it fine! We also had a detour through a debris field, a mount, and a back around a tree.

The new trail across the river was mainly on access roads for the Biltmore estate, which were excellent for trotting. We wound up and around the terrain, at several places looking down at the river and our campsite, although I didn't realize it was our campsite. I found a couple of really nice turkey feathers which I put in Terra's headstall. I also lost my crupper (the snap attached to the saddle came off at the swivel), but Lori Lee saw it and picked it up—thanks, Lori. Now I understand why Terra scooted forward at one point on our ascent—the crupper was sliding down her tail and hitting her legs.

Bill watched us go around a curve in the trail at an extended trot, looking at position and being on the correct lead around the curve. Later he watched us on a steep descent. We got down more quickly than expected for the second P&R on Sunday, causing the crew to rush to catch us. The final leg back to camp was all along the wide, flat, and scenic River Road—a great end to our CTR.

Terra had some issues and took a 2nd in AA Open



Heavyweight on her second and last AA ride. This may not be my last AA ride, but the next time I attempt it will be on (fingers crossed) Oco, Terra's daughter, as this has been Terra's final year with me as her rider. Thanks, Connie, for all you do for us. It was a great experience to ride a 3-day, 90-mile CTR again.

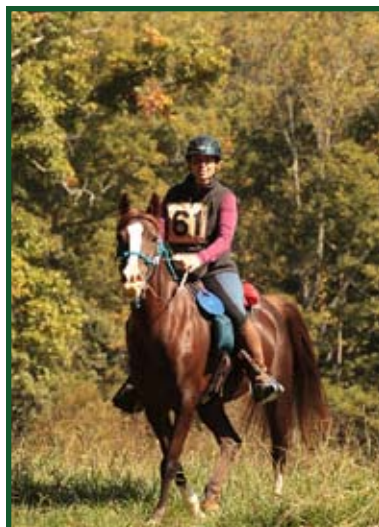
